Short biography and Aim of study:

The Primary Investigator is Dr. **Lailatun Ni'mah**, S.Kep., Ns., M.Kep.,. She is a nursing academic, clinician, and researcher at the Faculty of Nursing, Universitas Airlangga. She holds professional nursing qualifications and a master's degree in nursing, supported by doctoral-level training in nursing science.

This study aims to provide an in-depth understanding of patients' experiences with Continuous Ambulatory Peritoneal Dialysis (CAPD), the barriers they encounter, and the types of support they require. Such information is essential for nurses, physicians, policymakers, and healthcare providers in designing and implementing home-based care programs for CAPD patients, thereby contributing to the development of more effective care models in Indonesia. The findings of this study are expected to offer comprehensive insights into the

diverse experiences of patients undergoing CAPD, which may inform improved decision-making processes and the formulation of more evidence-based policies in the future.
